A.R.T. at Matignon, part of The Cambridge Matignon School's Cambridge Arts Academy, will foster the theater skills and artistic identity for emerging youth artists to hone their skills and become creative leaders. Public workshops for students in grades 8 through 12 offered include *Improvisation with Remo Airaldi*, Lecturer on Theater, Dance & Media at Harvard University. Workshop tuition is pay-what-you-can with a recommended price of \$50.

In this workshop, we will engage in committed, creative, and collaborative "play" that will tap into each student's personal, individual sense of fun. We will focus on the basics of improvisation. Improv is an ideal way to motivate "out-of-the-box" thinking, active listening, and communication—all crucial skills for the 21_{st} century. In a low-pressure, supportive environment, we'll introduce you to improv exercises that will boost self-confidence, develop spontaneity, and build a sense of ensemble. • Online Monday, February 28 At 7:30PM ET CIVICALLY SPEAKING: THE ODYSSEY IN ULYSSES

In celebration of the 100th anniversary of James Joyce's *Ulysses*, join A.R.T. for conversation exploring the connections between this iconic work and the source material that fundamentally inspired it: Homer's *Odyssey*. Classical studies scholar Joel Christensen (Brandeis University), Joyce scholar Douglas Mao (Johns Hopkins University), and noted playwright Kate Hamill (*Sense and Sensibility*) will juxtapose a scene from Hamill's new adaptation of *The Odyssey*, currently in development at A.R.T., exploring how the contemporary work is in dialogue with both the original epic poem and the landmark modernist novel.
