# AMERICAN REPERTORY THEATER ANNOUNCES WEST END HIT MUSICAL COMEDY TWO STRANGERS (CARRY A CAKE ACROSS NEW YORK) WILL NOW CONCLUDE ITS 2024/25 SEASON

Tickets go on sale to the public March 21 for the run that begins May 20

Cambridge, MA—American Repertory Theater (A.R.T.) at Harvard University, under the leadership of Diane Paulus and Kelvin Dinkins, Jr., announced today that it will produce the North American premiere of the West End hit *Two Strangers (Carry a Cake Across New York)* to conclude its 2024/25 Season. The "uplifting" (*British Vogue*), "fresh, funny, ironic, and moving" (*The Observer*) acclaimed new musical about new beginnings and seeing the world through fresh eyes is by **Jim Barne** and **Kit Buchan** and directed and choreographed by **Tim Jackson**.

**Two Strangers (Carry a Cake Across New York)** begins performances at the Loeb Drama Center in Harvard Square on Tuesday, May 20, opens officially on Friday, May 30, and runs through Sunday, June 29, 2025. Press will be invited to attend Wednesday, May 28. The production replaces the previously announced **Passing Strange**.

**Tickets from \$35** go on sale to the general public March 21; member presale begins March 15. Group sales (10+ tickets) are available now.

Naïve and impossibly upbeat Brit Dougal has just landed in New York for his dad's second wedding—the dad he's never known. Robin, the sister of the bride, is at the airport to pick him up—and she's late for work. Hungry for an adventure in the city he's only seen in movies, Dougal hopes native New Yorker Robin will be his guide. Taking inspiration from traditional rom-coms, this "fresh, funny, ironic, and inventive" (*The Observer*) new musical balances life's sweetness and struggle as Dougal and Robin discover the meaningful impact on each of their lives a stranger can make.

"The A.R.T. is excited to produce the North American premiere of this inventive and heartfelt new musical, *Two Strangers*. I can't wait to introduce our audiences to this show that has captured the hearts of its UK audiences," said Terrie and Bradley Bloom Artistic Director Diane Paulus.

"All of us at A.R.T. were deeply disappointed in January when we determined that we would no longer be able to produce *Passing Strange* due to unexpected costs that exceeded the production's original budget," said Executive Director Kelvin Dinkins, Jr. "We wish the production's incredible creative team terrific success moving forward."

Two Strangers (Carry a Cake Across New York) previously played at the Off-West End Kiln Theatre (The Wife of Willesden) and the West End's Criterion Theatre and featured scenic and costume design by Soutra Gilmour, lighting design by Jack Knowles, sound design by Tony Gayle, music supervision by Nick Finlow, and orchestrations by Lux Pyramid. Casting will be announced in the coming weeks.
